- DISCUSSION: ECAS meeting time for Spring 2024
 - Provost reserved time, Fridays 9-11:30
 - Discussion suggesting 10-11:30, depends on schedules of student reps, law school rep, and the permanent SEHS rep
- DISCUSSION: Assigning committees to select member for <u>Senate Meeting Prayer/Meditation</u>
 - Open call will be emailed to all senators
 - Will rotate between committees and the committee will identify someone
- DISCUSSION: 2024-2025 Academic Calendar
 - Invited speaker Lee Dixon, Associate Provost
 - \circ The calendar has been finalized by the academic calendar committee, this is just a notification
 - Some notable changes from prior years
 - On our typical start timeline, Fall grades would have been due 12/24, leads to concern with issues of getting all end of semester work complete in a timely manner
 - Need to start Fall semester earlier to address this (August 19th), but this is close to start of 9-month contracts beginning. Creates issues for departments that have meetings before the semester starts.
 - Q: Why can't we start on Wednesday? A: Parents want to move in on weekend and students will party too much if classes don't occur on Monday and Tuesday.
 - Q: Can we change the contract period? A: No, payroll runs on half month periods and it would require moving payroll.
 - No action, as this is already approved.
 - Discussion item: Fall is longer than Spring due to scheduling issues. Can we make them identical?
- UPDATE: Student withdrawal and leave of absence policy
 - Invited speaker Lee Dixon, Associate Provost.
 - The university has implemented a new policy and process for student withdrawals and leaves of absence
 - Students were getting lost in the processing of withdrawing or taking a leave of absence, process wasn't clear to either students or administration.
 - No policy on how students communicate that they are going to do either.
 - New form will begin a workflow to make sure student gets support and all the paperwork gets completed in a timely manner.
 - Set withdrawal dates upon which students will be automatically dropped from classes.
 - Discussion item: Basic information about determining a student's registration status is not in the catalog.
 - DISCUSSION and POSSIBLE VOTE: Assignments to Committees (see DOC 2007-05, page 31)
 - Several committees require faculty assignments
 - Appeals Review Committee
 - UNRC will run a nomination process for this position, names go to student development, student development picks among the names
 - University Elections Committee, ECAS member
 - 1-year appointment to replace Chris Roederer
 - Tabled until next week while we find out about duties and time requirements
 - Common Academic Policies Committee (CAP-C), student rep needed for fall 2023, selected by SGA; spring 24 will have 2 sabbatical replacements (libraries, humanities), replacements identified; consistent with procedure? See <u>DOC 2010-04</u>, page 21
 - CAP-C is supposed to include senators, but that hasn't been the practice

- Policy states that we appoint with consultation of dean and provost.
- Support for running this through the UNRC in the future.
- Tabled until we clarify appointments around substitutes for sabbatical appointments.
- Human Resources Advisory Committee, ECAS member; confirm length of appointment.
 - Reports are this committee has not been meeting.
 - What is ECAS/Senate role in addressing this, or not?
 - What is the composition of this committee? What is the committee role and policy?
 - ECAS is concerned that this hasn't been meeting frequently and significant benefit changes have occurred.
 - Erin Kunz will contact Troy Washington for clarification
- o UNRC needs representatives from SEHS, Humanities, and Engineering
 - Will use UNRC to fill in these roles
 - Need to elect a new chair of the committee
 - Jane Koester is working on process.
 - Allison Kinney will be on committee and will follow-up on by-laws and chair appointment process
 - Some election deadlines have been delayed until committee is reformed.
 - Will discuss progress next week.
- **DISCUSSION:** Senate priorities for AY 23-24
 - Refer to <u>list of potential priorities</u> generated by the senate officers based on last year's recommendations and broad consultation across the campus.
 - Discussed initiatives around APC and CAP
 - Tabled until next week.
- The following items were tabled until next week:
 - DISCUSSION Including University Policy Coordinating Committee (UPCC) as a consultant for senate policies prior to a vote.
 - UPCC is currently undergoing a comprehensive review of their outward facing policies posted to the <u>Academic Policies site</u> on udayton.edu. Any policy on that page will need to be reviewed by the UPCC prior to being posted on the site.
 - o DISCUSSION and POSSIBLE VOTE: Faculty Board guest other than the chair
 - Under the impression that the chair was the invited guest
 - <u>DOC 2007-05</u>, page 12 states: "A member of the Faculty Board attends the meetings of the Executive Committee as a non-voting participant."
 - DOC 2007-05, Faculty board may appoint a non-voting rep to each of the standing committees
