†REV. DOMINIC J. UNGER, O.F.M. Cap.

We just received notification of the death of Father Dominic J. Unger, O.F.M. Cap., at Hays, Kansas, on July 11, 1982. Father died of cancer, after a six-month battle with the disease. He was buried on July 14th, the 50th anniversary of his profession as a Capuchin; he was seventy-five years old.

Father Blaine Burkey, O.F.M. Cap., wrote that it is "my intention to prepare a preliminary bibliography and biography of Father Dominic, and I would be happy to provide you with this type of information upon its completion, if you inform me of your interest in same." As you will notice in the Secretary's Report on the 1982 Convention, Father Dominic was the initiator of the motion to revise the English translation of Eucharistic Prayer I to make it reflect the sense of *in primis* which it currently lacks. This was the last of a long series of his contributions to our Society, made over the course of a lifetime dedicated to the service of the Lord and the Blessed Virgin Mary.
