Main Question

Background

- 93,000 + caregivers in U.S.A. system (2017)
- Known educational disparity with affected children
- Steep resource costs [time, \$\$, etc.]
 - ❑ 25% of caregivers involved earn less than \$10,000 (2017)



U.S.A Policy

- County basis
- Strong family reunification
 - ❑ Parent Education
 - ❑ Family/Couples Counseling
 - ❑ Expectation of indiv. solutions, not admin based.



International Policies

- U.N. Treaty– Children must have contact when available & appropriate. (1990).
 - ❑ U.S.A. not ratified
- Country Basis
 - ❑ Sweden – Child first mentality [non-physical visits (2018)]

- U.S.A ratify U.N. Treaty on Child Rights
- Standardization across U.S.A. States
