Question: How does detached parenting affect family upbringing?

Abstract: This project is a literature review that focuses on family upbringing and its implications for the detachment of the children. Studies have shown there are a variety of factors that foster a relationship structure between children and their parents. Negative interactions have been described as encouraging detachment. Children have been described as ranging in the ages between preterms and 14 year olds.

Research:

Detached Parenting And Toddler Problem Behavior In Early Head Start Families

- Stress while parenting was related to increased levels of detachment.

Premature Birth: complexities and difficulties in building the mother-child relationship

- Preterm birth can be difficult when fostering interactions between mothers and premature babies.

Structured after-school activities as a moderator of depressed mood for adolescents with detached relations to their parents

- Afterschool activities for adolescents buffer and alleviate depression for adolescents in detached parent-adolescent relationships.

Is One Good Parent Good Enough? Patterns of Mother and Father Parenting and Child Cognitive Outcomes at 24 and 36 Months

- A child that has one parent who is described as supportive, would have high test score on cognitive stimulation test.

Discussion: There is a direct relationship with detached parenting and negative effects on upbringing. The implications of detachment on children affects children in many ways depending on the age group of the child.

Challenges & Limitations:

- Factors of detachment may alter when focusing on factors such as race and demographics.

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
