What is a Human Rights City?

- ▶ Defined as “a municipality that refers explicitly to the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and other international human rights standards and/or law in their policies, statements, and programs” (ushrnetwork.org)
- ▶ Emphasis on how human rights affect the lives of citizens in their local communities
- ▶ Facts:
 - ▶ 42 designated Human Rights Cities worldwide
 - ▶ 11 designated Human Rights Cities in the U.S.

What are the Sustainable Development Goals?

- ▶ The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) provide a “to-do list for people, the planet, and a blueprint for success” (un.org)
- ▶ 17 goals and 169 targets to be accomplished by 2030
- ▶ All countries are called to actively take steps toward achieving the SDGs



Connection to the Greater Dayton Region

- ▶ U.S ratified international human rights articles and SDG targets can be linked to local issues in the Greater Dayton region.
- ▶ These linkages can assist in the development of an advocacy campaign to make Dayton a Human Rights City.

Relevant targets:

- ▶ 6.1: Achieve universal access to safe and affordable water
- ▶ 6.3: Improve water quality by reducing pollution, eliminating dumping, and minimizing chemical releases
- ▶ 6.5: Implement integrated water resources through transboundary cooperation
- ▶ 6.6: Protect and restore water-related ecosystems
- ▶ 6.b: Strengthen the participation of local communities in improving water and sanitation management.

Advocacy Campaign Idea

Dayton Water Festival

- ▶ Inspired by Dayton Children's Water Festival
 - ▶ Annual event hosted at the University of Dayton for 2,000 4th grade students
 - ▶ Educates on groundwater, surface water, conservation, and land use with various games, exhibits, and entertainment (daytonohio.gov)
 - ▶ Encourages environmental values and life-long stewardship of the environment
- ▶ In order to accomplish SDG target 6.b, the participation of local communities in improving water and sanitation management must be strengthened
- ▶ A Water Festival for all ages, not only for children, would increase community participation in water management issues
- ▶ Programming would consist of education on water issues, management, and advocacy in Dayton in order to involve residents of all ages and backgrounds in water and sanitation management

Research Reflection

- ▶ My research on human rights-related local issues in Dayton has heightened my awareness of the region's assets and challenges. Regardless of a country's progress toward development, such issues are present and need to be addressed in order to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals. The Greater Dayton region has suffered from challenges related to clean water access and water pollution, but the region is also supported by assets which involve the community in clean water and sanitation advocacy. Such assets need to be expanded upon in order to ensure further community engagement in water related issues.
