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Bro. Joseph Mervar, business manager of the University of Dayton, announced today that Donald Shockley had been appointed to the newly-created position of Central Buyer for Food Services at the University. Mr. Shockley has been manager of the school's Marycrest Hall cafeteria for the past three years.

Bro. Mervar also revealed that Mr. Robert Schlaert from North Dakota State University had been named to replace Mr. Shockley at Marycrest, and that Mr. Arthur McCarthy, formerly with the United States Air Force Food Services, had been appointed manager of food services in the John F. Kennedy Memorial Union. All appointments are effective immediately.

Mr. Shockley came to Dayton with the Toddle House Corp. with whom he spent 12 years. Since coming to Dayton he has served as manager for food services at St. Elizabeth's Hospital and Elder, and was manager of Culp's downtown restaurant. He is a native of Dover, Delaware, and attended Ohio University.

Mr. Schlaert is a graduate of the University of Denver's Hotel Management School. Originally from Buffalo, New York, he served as assistant manager of food services at Colorado College in Colorado Springs, Colorado, and as manager of the Memorial Union food services at North Dakota State.

Mr. McCarthy has just retired from 20 years in the United States Air Force food services. His last assignment, while stationed at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base, was responsibility for feeding in air force bases throughout nine midwestern states. He won the Air Force's Hennessy Award in May. This is the top honor for food service people in the Air Force.
