DAYTON, Ohio, September 22, 1966 --- Brother Ralph Mravintz, S.M. Director of Admissions at the University of Dayton, has announced the appointment of five new staff members to the position of admissions representatives.

Comprised of one English graduate assistant, two graduate students and two undergraduate students, the new staff will represent the University of Dayton at College Nights held at high schools throughout the country. They will also supply high school guidance counselors with information concerning curriculum offered by the University of Dayton.

John F. Kennedy, a graduate teaching assistant in the University of Dayton's Department of English, is from Troy, New York. He received his B.A. in English from Niagara University, in June of 1965.

Mark Kochanowski from South Bend, Indiana, received his B.A. from the University of Dayton in December of 1965, and is currently working toward his Masters degree there. Mr. Kochanowski will visit high schools in the Chicago, Illinois, area.

Robert Polson, who received his B.A. from John Carroll University in June of 1965 and is presently taking education courses at the University of Dayton, is from Cleveland Heights, Ohio. He will be UD's representative in the Cleveland area.

Michael J. Ludvik, who is beginning his second year as an admissions representative in the New York area, is a University of Dayton senior history major from LaCrosse, Wisconsin. He is a member of Phi Alpha Theta, national History Fraternity, and past Chairman of Vertical Communications, a committee established to further administration-faculty-student communications.

Miss Anne K. Wiedemer, a University of Dayton senior who has had two years teaching experience in the New York area, is from Rochester, New York. She will represent UD at high schools in the greater metropolitan Dayton area. Miss Wiedemer is the first female representative hired by the Admissions Office at UD.
