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The University of Dayton will hold ground breaking ceremonies for its new Clarence H. Gosiger Health Center, Friday, February 25, at 2:00 p.m. on the University of Dayton Campus.

The structure, which will cost an estimated \$600,000 will be named for the late Clarence H. Gosiger, long-time member of the University's associate board of lay trustees.

The Gosiger family and others, made major contributions toward financing the 44 bed facility.

The center will be located on the U.D. main campus in the area between the Brothers' cemetery and the road leading to Stuart Hall for men.

Ground breaking ceremonies - Friday, February 25, 1966, 2:00 p.m.

Name - Clarence H. Gosiger Health Center - after the long-time member of the University's Associate Board of Lay Trustees and U. D. benefactor.

Building Location - On the main campus of the University of Dayton in the area between the Brothers' cemetery and the road leading to Stuart Hall for men.

Estimated Cost - \$600,000

Capacity - A 44-bed facility

General Discription - A two-story, red brick structure. The west wing will be used to house faculty members, the north wing for women students, and the east wing for men students. A lounge, double, quadruple, private and isolation rooms will be located on the first floor of each wing. The west end of the ground floor will house the student clinic which will be composed of four (4) examination rooms, an X-ray area, various treatment rooms and a chapel. Air conditioned and electrically heated, the building will have an unusual system of air circulation which will furnish each room with its own air supply to insure sanitary conditions. The second floor of the building will allow for expansion in the future. A new health center is needed because present (located in Alumni Hall) are inadequate in meeting on-campus housing which has grown from about 500 in 1959 to almost 3,000 at the present time.
