A University of Dayton faculty member has been singled out for honors in the field of Philosophy.

Thomas J. Casaletto, an instructor in the U.D. Philosophy Department, has been selected by the Ohio Philosophy Association to deliver a speech, "Some Considerations on the Relationship Between Panpsychism and Pantheism in Spinoza's Ethics" at the groups Annual Meeting.

The address will be taken from a Paper which Professor Casaletto had written and submitted to the Association. The annual meeting will take place Saturday, April 2, 1966 at Kent State University.

Professor Casaletto joined the University of Dayton faculty in 1964. He received his master's degree from Notre Dame University in 1963 and his bachelor's degree from Aquinas College in 1960 and is presently working on his Ph.D. at the University of Cincinnati.
