DAYTON, Ohio, May 23, 1967 --- Dr. George J. Ruppel, S.M. of the University of Dayton History Department, was elected Chairman (President) for 1967-68 of the Ohio Area Honors Association at the annual meeting May 12-13 at Allegheny College, Meadville, Pennsylvania.
