DAYTON, Ohio, July 31, 1967 --- Four new members will join the History Department faculty at the University of Dayton this fall, according to Dr. Wilfred Steiner, Chairman of the Department of History.

Mr. Tong-Chin Rhee of Seoul, Korea, comes to U.D. with an impressive academic record. He holds a bachelors degree in political science and a Master of Public Administration from Seoul National University. He earned a Master of Arts degree in International Relations and International Law at Lehigh University and received his Ph.D. at Clark University in Massachusetts. The former research assistant at the Smithsonian Institute has been appointed to the rank of Assistant professor of History at U.D.

Sister Mary Evelyn Jegen, S.N.D., also appointed as assistant professor of History, is a native of Chicago, Illinois. She specializes in Medieval European History, the field in which she received her Ph.D. from St. Louis University. Sister has served as a lecturer on Western Civilization at St. Louis University and was an instructor at the College of Notre Dame before coming to U.D. Her writings have been published in The New Catholic Encyclopedia, Masterpieces of Catholic Literature and she has had articles appear in "The Catholic Times" in Columbus, "The Torch" in New York and Commonweal magazine.

Mr. Bruce M. Taylor of Brooklyn, New York, received his B.A. in economics at Dartmouth College and M.A. in History at Columbia University. He has taught World History and Latin American History at New Rochelle High School and is presently a Ph.D. candidate at Fordham University. His achievements include a World History textbook published by the New Rochelle Board of Education. He will serve as an assistant professor of history.

Appointed to the rank of instructor of History is Mr. Jules J. Pugach of Brooklyn, New York. He is a graduate of Brooklyn College and did his masters work under a fellowship at the University of California at Berkeley. He is a Ph.D. candidate at the University of Florida where he served as an interim instructor of history during the summer of 1965.
