DAYTON, Ohio, August 24, 1967 --- Colonel Uel French, Chairman, Department of Military Science at the University of Dayton, has announced the assignment of four officers to his department.

Lt. Col. William F. Murley, a native of Tennessee, is coming to the University after a tour of duty in Vietnam. While in Vietnam Lt. Col. Murley was awarded the bronze star for the development of the civic action program of all the United States Special Forces there. He is a 1965 graduate of the University Omaha. He also graduated from the U.S. Army Command and General Staff School in 1961. He is married and the father of Christopher and Kim, 12 years and six months respectively.

Captain Edward C. Smith, born in Cleveland, received his BBA in marketing from Western Reserve University in 1960 and graduated from the Officer Candidate School at Fort Benning, Georgia, in 1963. He recently served in the I Corp Area, DMZ, Northern Provinces, at Quan Tri and Thusa Thien. He and his wife have a daughter, Deborah Ann, born last October.

First Lieutenant Robert Anderson, originally from Midland, Michigan, also comes from Vietnam where he fought with the 1st Air Cavalry Division in the Central Highlands. He attended the University of Michigan and then graduated from the United States Military Academy at West Point, New York, in 1965. He hopes to take graduate work in political science while in the states.

Captain Thomas O'Brien is a 1963 graduate of the University of Dayton and received his commission upon graduation. A native of Ossining, New York, Captain O'Brien received a bronze star medal with "V" Device, and the Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry with Silver Star while in Vietnam. He has a son, Thomas III, born February 18 of this year.
