Four professors of psychology, all University of Dayton graduates, will be teaching in their alma mater's Psychology Department this fall, Dr. Samuel M. Bower, Chairman, Psychology Department, announced today.

The four, Rev. Edward J. Kalmanek, C.P.P.S., a Precious Blood priest; Edgar Warren Waybright, Thomas W. Reuth and Leo T. Kempel, will hold the rank of instructor when the 1967-68 school year opens September 5.

All four received their bachelor degrees from UD in either 1963 or 1964. Rev. Kalmanek, who is a native of Detroit, received his degree in psychology in 1964 after having received a degree in philosophy, 1947, and theology, 1951, from St. Charles Seminary in Carthage, a University of Dayton affiliate. Father Kalmanek has completed his masters requirements at UD.

While attending UD since 1962 he has served as Director of the Religious Formation Program of the Precious Blood Society.

Mr. Reuth, who was born in Dayton, has completed all masters requirements but his thesis. He has served as a laboratory instructor at UD and as psychology assistant at Dayton State Hospital while pursuing his masters at the University. He received his bachelor degree in 1963.

Mr. Waybright, who graduated from Wilmington College in 1965, has completed his masters requirements in clinical psychology at UD. During his recent studies at the University he has served as research assistant in the Psychology Department and as psychology assistant at Dayton State Hospital.

Mr. Kempel, who comes from Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio, has been under a graduate assistantship at UD since 1965 and will receive his masters in clinical psychology in December. He also has been taking diagnostic training at the Dayton State Hospital. He graduated from UD in 1964.

Other professors in the department are Dr. Bower, Dr. John Davis, Dr. Robert Noland, Dr. Antos Rancurello, Mr. Joseph Rosa, Dr. Lester Shine and Dr. John Snide.
