DAYTON, Ohio, March 5, 1968 --- Dr. Leon Goldman, one of the foremost experts on the safety of the laser for medical uses, will discuss this subject, "Lasers---Temporary or Omnipotence," at the annual University of Dayton Honors Banquet tomorrow, March 6, in the Kennedy Union Ballroom. Forty-six academic awards of excellence to students in 27 academic disciplines and April honors graduates will be feted at this banquet which starts at 6 p.m.

Previously held in the UD Fieldhouse as an afternoon Honors Convocation, the University has invited honored students, their parents and one professor each for this special banquet.

Dr. Goldman, who is Chairman, Department of Dermatology, College of Medicine, University of Cincinnati and Director of the school's Laser Laboratories, has been in laser research for seven years under the sponsorship of the Public Health Service and is in great demand for advice, articles and lectures on the subject. He has written two books, "The Laser in Cancer Research," and "Biomedical Applications of the Laser."

Dr. Goldman will become Director of the National Repository of Data on Laser Accidents and Laser Safety which will be established soon at the University of Cincinnati. It is to be created by the United States Public Health Service.

A 1929 medical graduate of UD, he is a member of many organizations relating to dermatology, tropical medicine and history of medicine. He has had a Research Fellowship at the University of Zurich and was a Markle Fellow in Tropical Dermatology.
