DAYTON, Ohio, January 28, 1969 --- Mr. Moses O. Ihonde, the Nigerian Ambassador to the United Nations, will open the International Week festivities this Friday, January 31, on the University of Dayton campus. He will speak at 4:30 p.m. in the Boll Theater on the subject of "Nigeria and Biafra."

International Week, an annual activity which will run until February 7 this year, will feature a foreign bazaar in the Kennedy Union Art Gallery, informal talks on Russia, the space program, Vietnam, the Middle East crisis, the Far East, and Germany, a karate demonstration, a Night in Italy program, and a wedding from India.

- FRIDAY, JANUARY 31: An address by Mr. Moses O. Ihonde, the Nigerian Ambassador to the United Nations, Boll Theater, 4:30 p.m.
- SATURDAY, FEBRUARY 1: Foreign Bazaar from A Shop Called East which will feature international art pieces in metalwork, woodwork, ceramics, African drums, Japanese China, carved ivory and brass pieces from India. Displays starts at 10 a.m. and closes at 10 p.m. from this date until February 5.
- MONDAY, FEBRUARY 3: Coffee Hour, Kennedy rooms 159-160, 4 p.m.-6 p.m., an informal talk on Russia by Dr. Laura Pollack. Snack Bar, 7 p.m., a Karate demonstration by the Frank Grant Karate Club of Dayton.
- TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 4: Life in Space Coffee Hour, Kennedy rooms 159-160, 4 p.m.-6 p.m., a special space program co-ordinated by Mr. Joseph Rosa of the UD faculty.
- WEDNESDAY, FEBRUARY 5: Panel Discussion, "In Quest of a Solution for the Middle East," with Phil Donahue of WLW-D as moderator in Boll Theater at 2:30 p.m. Panel members, Dr. Gad Soffer of the History Department, and Dr. Hani Fakhouri of the Sociology Department. Dr. Soffer is a native of Israel and Dr. Fakhouri of Jordan.
- Informal Talk on Vietnam and other Far Eastern countries by Mr. William Stratton of the American Red Cross at Wright Patterson Air Force Base, Kennedy room 159-160, from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m.
- THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 6: Coffee Hour, Kennedy rooms 159-160, from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m., an informal talk on Germany by Mr. Thomas Frawley, News Director, WHIO-TV.
- A Wedding from India, performed by U.D. students from India, Snack Bar, 6:30 p.m.
- FRIDAY, FEBRUARY 7: Coffee Hour in music in Kennedy rooms 159-160 from 4 p.m. to 6 p.m.
- A Night in Italy, featuring Italian food and a dance band, Snack Bar from 7:30 p.m. to midnight.

An added attraction involving the International community at the University will be the International dinner dance, entitled "An International Valentine," in the Kennedy Union Ballroom, starting at 7:30 p.m. Following the dinner, Paul Little's Orchestra will play for dancing.
