DAYTON, Ohio, August 6, 1968 --- The creation of an Information Center at the University of Dayton was announced today by Bro. Elmer C. Lackner, S.M., Vice President for Public Relations. The Center, under the direction of Mrs. Gabriel F. Vacca, will be located off the lobby of the John F. Kennedy Memorial Union in room 139.

The Center is being formed, according to Bro. Lackner, to provide a central location for general and specific information concerning the University of Dayton. All activities within the University will be catalogued in the Information Center and a staff assigned to answer questions and keep the necessary information up-to-date.

Mrs. Vacca, according to Bro. Lackner, will develop a schedule of events on a monthly basis and distribute it throughout the campus. He said that the Center will serve as a reference bureau for those interested in events at the University.
