DAYTON, Ohio, November 25, 1968 --- Father John Harrington, S.M., assistant professor of Theological Studies at the University of Dayton, will present the second in a series of six lecture-discussions on Pope Paul's encyclical, *Humanae Vitae*, December 3 at 7:30 p.m. in Wohlleben Auditorium. The series sponsored by the Theology Department at UD is being held in relation to the current questions regarding authority in the church and the encyclical.

The topic of Father Harrington's lecture will be "Authority and the Natural Law", followed by two responders and a question-and-answer period.

Father Harrington joined the University of Dayton's theological staff in 1956. In 1958 until 1964 he taught at St. Patrick's College in Asaba, Nigeria, West Africa, and returned to UD in 1965.

A native of Baltimore, Maryland, Father Harrington was born in 1923. He graduated from the University of Dayton in 1944 with a B.A. and received his S.T.B. and S.T.L. degrees from the University of Fribourg in Switzerland in 1951 and 1953. In 1954 he graduated from the University of St. Thomas in Rome with his S.T.D. degree.

A member of the Society of Catholic College Teachers of Sacred Doctrine, Father Harrington is the author of various articles in numerous periodicals such as the *Marianist Educator* and the *Columbia Review*.
