DAYTON, Ohio, December 3, 1968 --- Dr. James Hal Cone, Assistant Professor of Religion at Adrian College, Adrian, Michigan, will be the first guest speaker in The Theology Department Lecture Series which will open Monday, December 9 at 8 P.M., in the Boll Theater. The topic of Dr. Cone's lecture will be "Christianity and Black Power."

Dr. Cone was previously Assistant Professor of Philosophy and Religion at Philander Smith College in Little Rock, Arkansas where he received his B.A. in 1958. In 1961 Dr. Cone received his B.D. from Garrett Theological Seminary, Evanston, Illinois. In 1963 he received his MA and in 1965 his PhD from Northwestern University, Evanston, Illinois.

Dr. Cone is the author of "Christianity and Black Power" in Is Anybody Listening to Black America? by C. Eric Lincoln and Black Theology and Black Power to be published by Seabury Press in the Spring of 1969. Dr. Cone is also included in A Pictorial History of the Negro in America, revised and expanded by C. Eric Lincoln and Milton Meltzer.
