Dr. Perry Yaney of the University of Dayton's Department of Physics has been selected to attend the "Physics of Quantum Electronics" seminar at Northern Arizona University this month. The 11-day program is a continuation of the tutorial symposium conducted at Colorado State University in 1966 and 1967 and at the University of Arizona last summer.

The program is designed for advanced students, research scientists and technical administrators working in the general area of quantum electronics. The course consists of 60 hours of lecture, each 90 minutes long, and is given by the top men in the field.

Dr. Yaney, who has his doctorate from the University of Cincinnati, has been with the University of Dayton since 1963.

The Department of Secretarial Studies at the University of Dayton will conduct a Stenograph Workshop on July 2. The program, which will be conducted in Miriam Hall starting at 9 a.m. will be under the direction of Mrs. Velma Miller of UD.

Dr. Praphulla K. Bajpai, professor of biology at the University of Dayton, has been appointed as a participant in the Bio-Space Technology Training Program at the Wallops Island, Virginia, by the University of Virginia. The program, which runs from August 5 to August 20, is conducted under the National Aeronautic Space Program.

Dr. Bajpai, who has been with UD since 1964, has degrees from Agra University in India and Ohio State University. His doctorate is from OSU in 1965.
