DAYTON, Ohio, September 29, 1969 --- Less than two weeks remain for prospective teachers who plan to take the National Teacher Examinations at University of Dayton on November 8, 1969, to submit their registrations for these tests to Educational Testing Service, Princeton, New Jersey, Joseph J. Panzer, S.M., Dean, School of Education announced today. Registrations for the examinations must be forwarded so as to reach the Princeton Office not later than October 16, Dean Panzer advised.

Bulletins of Information describing registration procedures and containing registration forms may be obtained from Joseph J. Panzer, S.M., School of Education, University of Dayton, or directly from the National Teacher Examinations, Educational Testing Service, Box 911, Princeton, New Jersey 08540.

At the one-day test session a candidate may take the Common Examinations, which include tests in Professional Education and General Education, and one of the fifteen Teaching Area Examinations which are designed to evaluate his understanding of the subject matter and methods applicable to the area he may be assigned to teach.

Each candidate will receive an Admission Ticket advising him of the exact location of the center to which he should report, Dr. Panzer advised. Candidates for the Common Examinations will report at 8:30 a.m. on November 8, and should finish at approximately 12:30 p.m. Dean Panzer said. The Teaching Area Examinations will begin at 1:30 p.m. and should finish at approximately 4:15 p.m., according to the time schedule for these examinations which has been set up by Educational Testing Service.
