DAYTON, Ohio, October 7, 1969 --- Archbishop Thomas D'Esterre Roberts, S.J., from London, England; Dr. Ralph Templin, Ph.D., Cedarville, Ohio; Rev. William Ferree, S.M., Cincinnati Provincial, Society of Mary, and the Movie "The Battle of Algiers" are the features of this fall's Religion in Life Series. The program is under the direction of Bro. Leo Murray, S.M., who successfully served as host for the Black Sisters Conference this past summer.

Archbishop Roberts will discuss "War and Peace" in the Boll Theater on October 16 at 8 p.m. He was the consecrated Archbishop of Bombay, India, in 1937 and served there until 1950. His Grace was also a Military Delegate for British and Allied forces in India during World War II.

He is the author of From The Bridge (1939) and Black Popes (use and abuse of authority), and has another, The Book of Bathsheba, in preparation. He also has written articles on marriage, conscientious objection and contraception.

Dr. Templin will speak on "Non-Violence and Pacifism--Responses to War" at the October 30 seminar in the Kennedy Union Ballroom, also at 8 p.m. Dr. Templin is professor emeritus in sociology at Central State University. He is conversant with Mahatma Ghandi's non-violent movement and has worked with non-violent groups in this country. He is the author of Democracy and Non-Violence, 1965, and is presently editor of the Journal of Human Relations.

Father Ferree's program, "No More War--through organization," will be presented in the Ballroom on November 13 at 8 p.m. Father Ferree, who as a priest has served in the international religious field, was appointed Provincial in August, 1968. He is the author of "Introduction to Social Justice" and has participated in conferences and congresses on social problems in America and Europe for 20 years. He spent a year as President of Chaminade College, Marianist school in Honolulu.

The movie, "Battle of Algiers," done in news documentary style, will be shown in the Boll Theater on December 4 at 7:30 p.m. It runs two hours. The film shows the holocaust which can result from violent movements, or revolutions. It shows that the physical force of the French could not down the "soul" force of the Algerians who were willing to lay down their lives for their independence. Much loss of innocent lives took place during this revolution.
