DAYTON, Ohio, May 2, 1969 --- The Very Rev. Raymond A. Roesch, S.M., President of the University of Dayton, has announced the appointment of Dr. Joseph W. Stander, S.M., as Dean for Graduate Studies and Research. Dr. Stander succeeds Bro. Austin J. Holian, S.M., who asked to be relieved of some of his duties at the University for health reasons. Brother Holian is also a professor of electrical engineering.

Dr. Stander has been assistant dean and a member of the Department of Mathematics. A native of Covington, Kentucky, he is a graduate of U.D. ('49) and of Catholic University, Washington, D.C., where he received his doctorate in 1959. The following year he joined the U.D. faculty as an assistant professor of mathematics and was appointed associate professor in 1965.

He has taught at the old Hamilton (Ohio) Catholic High and at Collegio Ponceno, Ponce, Puerto Rico.

On several occasions he has served as acting chairman of U.D.'s Department of Mathematics and has taught at the University's summer institutes of mathematics. He also served as director of a summer institute sponsored by the National Science Foundation at the Catholic University of Puerto Rico.

Dr. Stander will be concerned with the supervision of existing graduate programs and research at U.D. and will assist in the development of new programs.

The North Central Association recently gave full accreditation to 15 U.D. programs on the masters level and to the new doctoral program in biology.
