DAYTON, Ohio, November 12, 1969 --- Dr. Gad Soffer, University of Dayton history professor who was born and raised in Israel, will present the first in a series of half hour television programs entitled "As the World Sees US," this Sunday, November 16, at 11 a.m. on WLW-D, Channel 2. The series is being produced in cooperation with George Biersack, Chairman, Department of Communication Arts, and WLW-D.

The show is designed to explore the image of the United States as it is reflected in the native press of countries throughout the World. It will feature bilingual guests who will discuss the main issues of their area of expertise. Most of the guests will come from area universities.

Sunday's show will feature India and have Dr. Emanuel Thomas, a University of Dayton sociology professor from Madras, India, and Dr. Kanwal Kumar, presently employed in NCR's Operation Evaluation department. He is a former UD professor and from Northern India.

The Sunday, November 23, program will feature China. Panelists will be Dr. Byron Weng of Wright State University and Dr. Frank Wong, Chairman of the History Department at Antioch College. A special guest will be Dr. David Owen of Antioch, whose expertise is in Chinese languages.

Dr. Jackson Baily of the School of International Studies at Earlham College and Dr. T. C. Rhee of UD's History Department will discuss Japan on the Sunday, November 30, program. Both men are experts on the Far East.

Arrangements are now being made for future programs.
