DAYTON, Ohio, March 22, 1971 --- Members of Epsilon Delta Tau, professional/social fraternity for engineering and technology students at the University of Dayton, will be a busy group this Saturday.

The organization will honor two UD professors and a Dayton engineer at a breakfast in the morning in the Kennedy Union and then embark around noon on a community project for the Burns-Jackson Neighborhood Association.

The professors, one each from the School of Engineering and the Technical Institute, will receive Outstanding Professors awards for excellent performance in teaching, research and extracurricular activities at the University of Dayton during the past year. The Dayton engineer will be honored for his efforts in behalf of the University of Dayton and the Dayton community.

The Burns-Jackson project will involve the installation of horseshoe courts, park benches, sand boxes, seesaws, and a small gym set on the property at 24-26 Jones Street. The program is being accomplished in cooperation with the local neighborhood association and the City Beautiful Commission.
