DAYTON, Ohio, April 19, 1971 --- Jack Meagher, Dayton lawyer, has been elected President of the University of Dayton's Greater Dayton Chapter of the National Alumni Association by members of the Chapter Board. His term, which begins immediately, is for one year. The Board serves as spokesman for 8,500 of the University's 23,000 alumni.

"I hope to see that the Board is effective as a spokesman," says Meagher, who graduated from the University in 1963 and received his law degree from the University of Cincinnati in 1966. He served with the U.S. Army in Vietnam in 1967 and 1968.

It is Meagher's job to select an 18-member board before the May 11 meeting. "I'm trying to find people from all age groups who have never served on an alumni board but who have expressed an interest in their university since their graduation," he says. "I want this to be an action board. Times are changing and alumni should develop programs which support the interests of both the alumni and the university.

"While we will be involved in fund-raising, I look upon our work as one of involvement in all ways possible. We're going to ask the people in the University community what we can do for them and then develop a collective partnership which will serve every facet of university life.

"Alumni have a stake in their university," he concluded. "This stake is especially true in light of the troubled times all universities are finding themselves in. The alumni is one group, with its varied expertise, which can help to pull the university out of these troubles."

Meagher, who is currently President of the Montgomery County Young Democrats, also serves with the Greater Dayton Jaycees, the Montgomery County Historical Society, and is a trustee of the Gem City Club. His professional memberships include American Trial Lawyers Association, Ohio Bar Association, American Bar Association, National Association of Defense Lawyers, Federal Bar Association and on the board of directors of the Chancery Club.
