DAYTON, Ohio, June 9, 1971 --- Stanley Z. Greenberg, former all-city basketball player at Philadelphia's Central High School and now a Dayton lawyer, has been appointed to the University of Dayton Board of Trustees, H. Talbott Mead, Chairman of the Board and President of the Mead Investment Company, announced today. Mr. Greenberg, who was a basketball star at the University in the late 1950s and early 1960s, is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Norman Greenberg, 2132 Benson Street, Philadelphia.

Mr. Greenberg, who is a partner in the Dayton law firm of Iddings, Jeffreys, Donnelly and Greenberg, is a 1957 graduate of Central and received his University of Dayton degree in business administration, accounting, in 1962. His law degree is from the University of Cincinnati in 1965.

While at Central he earned three basketball letters as a guard and three as a second baseman in baseball. He earned three basketball monograms at UD and was a member of the University's first National Invitational Tournament champions in 1962. He was on the Dean's list, was named to The Top Twenty Students, and was Top ROTC Cadet as a junior and senior at UD.

The 32-year-old lawyer also was President of the Student Council while at UD and President of the University of Cincinnati College of Law Bar Association.

Following UC graduation he served a year in the infantry in Vietnam, being awarded the Bronze Star. He is married to the former Stanlee Scott of Dayton. The couple has two children.
