DAYTON, Ohio, December 15, 1970 --- Donald L. Moon, assistant professor, Department of Electrical Engineering, University of Dayton, was awarded a National Science Foundation, Science Faculty Fellowship for 1971 according to an NSF announcement released December 10, 1970. Science Faculty Fellowships assist college and university science teachers to "enhance their effectiveness as teachers."

Mr. Moon is one of 213 Science Faculty Fellows chosen from all sections of the United States for the 1971 program. A total of 982 applicants vied for the honors.

Successful applicants were selected on the basis of ability as indicated by letters of recommendation, professional and academic records, and other evidence of promise and attainment. All applications were evaluated by panelists appointed by the Association of American Colleges, and successful applicants were selected by the National Science Foundation.

Professor Moon will pursue Fellowship studies at the Ohio State University on the Doctoral level.
