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## Dr. Joan Baratz as First Speaker for "Intervention Research with Children."

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DAYTON, Ohio, May 3, 1972 --- The Psychology Department at the University of Dayton is presenting Dr. Joan Baratz as the first in a series of speakers in a summer seminar on "Intervention Research with Children." Dr. Baratz is eminently qualified to speak on the subject, having been in childhood education since 1962. She will speak on Tuesday, May 9, in the Kennedy Union Ballroom. Her 8:00 p.m. speech will be concerned with the "Ethics of Preschool Compensatory Education."

Dr. Baratz, who is presently the Co-Director of the Education Study Center in Washington, D.C., received her Bachelor's and Master's degrees from Queens College, in New York, and her Ph.D. from the University of Kansas, Lawrence, Kansas. Her expertise has been built upon such professional positions as speech professor, language pathologist, and Associate Director for the Sociolinguistics Program, Urban Language Study, at the Center for Applied Linguistics. She has published many articles on speech and children's education, and has been the recipient of four grants for her research work. Among her other duties, she is the consultant to a Ford sponsored Interdisciplinary Committee on Reading Problems, and the Field Reader for the Office of Education.

The lecture is part of a summer seminar for graduate students conducted by Dr. Dale Goldhaber, of the U.D. Psychology Department, on the Psychological Aspects of Preschool Compensatory Education. The seminar, which runs from May to August is funded through a Title I grant of the NDEA Act of 1965.
