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## Five Criminal Justice Professional to Serve as Faculty for Criminal Justice Program

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DAYTON, Ohio, August, 1972 --- Five off-campus professionals in the fields of criminal justice and law will serve as a part of the faculty of the University of Dayton's Criminal Justice Program during the coming 1972-73 school year. The five will be teaching new and updated courses in these areas. The school year starts August 28.

Judge Roger Makley of the U.S. District Court, the Southern District, Western Division, will teach two courses, "Criminal Law" and "Law of Evidence and Procedure." Frank Schubert, Administrative Assistant to the Director of Police, Dayton Police Department, will instruct in "Community and Public Relations" while Robert A. Steinberg, U.S. Federal District Attorney of Dayton, will teach "Organized Crime".

James J. Granfield, Associate Director, Correction, U.S. Criminal Justice Pilot Cities Program, Community Research Inc., will serve as a professor in the Winter term on "Corrections." John Meagher, local attorney, will teach "Drug Addiction" during the both terms.

Judge Makley and District Attorney Steinberg will teach both terms while Mr. Schubert's course will be conducted in the fall term only.

The appearance of these men on the UD faculty is part of James Adamitis' effort to find part-time teachers who deal daily with the practicalities of criminal justice.

"This field is constantly growing and changing," says Mr. Adamitis, "And we must stay in contact if our program is going to have any value to these men and women who will eventually graduate into this very important field."
