DAYTON, Ohio, October 13, 1972-----Dr. T. C. Rhee of the University of Dayton History Department, whose article, "Japan: Same Bed, Different Dreams", has been published in the revision of Frederick Hartmann's book, World in Crisis, will serve as the instructor for the University's Special Sessions course, "Current World Affairs". The course, which is still opened to registration will start on Monday, October 16, in room 310 of the Kennedy Union. There are four sessions from 7:30 P.M. to 9:30 P.M. on the 16th, 23rd, 30th and November 6.

Dr. Rhee, who has been one of a few scholars invited to present papers before the University of Brussels' symposiums on China last fall and spring, is considered one of the top scholar experts on the Far East. His articles have been published extensively in magazines, books and other periodicals concerning the Asian mainland and its surrounding area.

Course content will include changes in international relations since 1945, United States, Soviet Union, China and Japan: Areas of Discord and Agreement; Pentagonal balance of Power: Value and Problems, prospective changes in world scene.
