"BEING BRIGHT IS NOT ENOUGH,"  
TOPIC OF LECTURE AT UD

DAYTON, Ohio, November 3, 1982 -- "Being Bright is Not Enough: Emotional Needs of Gifted Children," will be the topic of a lecture to be given by James Webb of Wright State University on Thursday, November 11 at 8 p.m. at the University of Dayton. The lecture will be presented in Wohlleben Hall 218 and is the second in a four-part colloquium series sponsored by the UD Department of Psychology.

Webb is a clinical psychologist and is also professor and assistant dean for Special Program Development at the School of Professional Psychology at Wright State University.

At Wright State, Webb has helped to develop a program focusing on the emotional needs of gifted children and their families. He currently conducts guidance discussion groups for parents of gifted children and is a consultant to numerous groups, professionals, and others who work with gifted and talented persons.

In 1981, Webb appeared on the Phil Donahue show with the parents of Dallas Egbert. In August 1982, his work with gifted children resulted in a highly successful national conference on Supporting Emotional Needs of Gifted Children. Recently he co-authored a book entitled Guiding the Gifted Child: A Practical Source for Parents and Teachers.
