### FRIGIDAIRE SCHOLARSHIPS AWARD \$100,000 TO COLLEGE STUDENTS

DAYTON, Ohio, August 3, 1983 -- The Dayton-Miami Valley Consortium of Colleges and Universities and the University of Dayton will announce the winners of the 1983 Frigidaire Scholarships for high school and college students at a reception for the recipients and their parents. The reception will be held Thursday, August 11 at 9 a.m. in the Torch Lounge of the University of Dayton John F. Kennedy Memorial Union. Brother Raymond L. Fitz, S.M., president of the University of Dayton and chairman of the Dayton-Miami Valley Consortium, will acknowledge the students' accomplishments along with Consortium president Presley McCoy.

The scholarship winners are chosen by the General Motors Frigidaire Employees' Recreation Association (FERA), an independent Ohio non-profit organization. The FERA selection committee chooses students solely on academic merit, however certain criteria must be met for application. The applicant must be a current or retired employee of the Frigidaire Division of General Motors or the spouse or child of a current or retired employee of the Frigidaire Division of General Motors. After December 31, 1984 the scholarship will be open to employees and their immediate families of any General Motors division in Montgomery County. The applicant must also attend one of the Miami-Valley

Consortium colleges or universities as a full-time student.

The 33 students will receive approximately \$100,000 collectively. The amount per student can be up to 100% of the tuition fee of the college plus book fees. This is the fourth year the scholarships have been awarded.

The Dayton-Miami Valley Consortium is made up of area colleges and universities that cooperate on various programs and projects to benefit higher education and the students who attend these institutions. Member institutions include the Air Force Institute of Technology, Antioch College, Central State University, Clark Technical College, University of Dayton, Edison State College, Kettering College of Medical Arts, Sinclair Community College, Southern State Community College, United Theological Seminary, Urbana College, Wilberforce University, Wilmington College, Wittenberg University, and Wright State University.
