LOVELACE JOINS NEIGHBORHOOD DEVELOPMENT OFFICE

DAYTON, Ohio, September 13, 1983 -- Dean A. Lovelace has joined the Strategies for Responsible Development (SRD) Office at the University of Dayton as the new director of SRD University Outreach - according to Brother Phil Aaron, S.M., director of Strategies for Responsible Development.

Lovelace comes to UD from the City of Dayton where he was most recently coordinator of the Northwest Office of Neighborhood Affairs (1979-83). Before that he was the Community Service Advisor/Planner for the Office of Neighborhood Affairs (1977-79), and a research planner for the Department of Planning (1973-77) for the City.

In his new position, Lovelace will serve as a liaison between SRD and Dayton neighborhood groups, making the human and program resources of the University available to the community. He will assist neighborhood groups in organizing their development efforts and will promote UD involvement in Dayton area neighborhood projects.

A graduate of Jefferson Township High School and Sinclair Community College, Lovelace has a B.S. in Business Administration from the University of Dayton and a M.S. in Applied and Social Economics from Wright State University. He is a member of various community organizations including Edgemont Neighborhood Coalition, West Montgomery County Food Program, Black Leadership Program Steering Committee, Peoples Resources of Southwest Ohio, and the Dayton Urban League.

The Strategies for Responsible Development Office is designed to assist the University in addressing the social, economic, and ecological needs of the community. The projects join the technical competencies of the University with emerging Catholic Church missions aimed at human development. The projects also expand neighborhood involvement and strengthen the efforts of neighborhood organization. A specific goal of SRD is to develop stronger ties between UD and the black community. Successful programs such as the Edgemont Neighborhood Solar Garden/Greenhouse best illustrate the outreach opportunities of SRD.
