NATIONAL ISSUES FORUM PRESENTS
"NUCLEAR ARMS AND NATIONAL SECURITY"

DAYTON, Ohio, November 4, 1983 -- Nuclear Arms and National Security is the last topic to be discussed as a part of the National Issues Forum sponsored by the Domestic Policy Association. The National Issues Forum is a nationwide, community-based series of open discussions designed to focus attention on major domestic policy issues. The six local sponsors are Sinclair Community College, Wright State University, University of Dayton, the Junior League, The League of Women Voters, and the Dayton Council on World Affairs.

The discussion will focus on questions such as "Should outer space be used as a launching point for missiles? What method of missile deployment is most practical and defensible? And is it wise to advocate unilateral disarmament?" It will meet Monday, November 14, at 7:30 p.m. at the University of Dayton Kennedy Union room 222; Tuesday, November 15, at 7:30 p.m. at the Wright Library, Oakwood; Wednesday, November 16, at 7:30 p.m. at Sinclair Community College Alumni Room 7342; and Thursday, November 17 at 7 p.m. at the Wright State University, University Center, room 155B.

The sessions are free and each topic is addressed in a 36-page book based on impartial background information. The books may be purchased for one dollar upon registering for the sessions.
