EIGHTH ANNUAL COMPUTER FAIR  
TO BE HELD IN UD ARENA

DAYTON, Ohio, March 7, 1984 -- The University of Dayton Office for Computing Activities has announced its Eighth Annual Computer Fair, to be held in the UD Arena on Tuesday, March 27, from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., and Wednesday, March 28, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

The fair will feature over 35 booths with exhibitors on hand to display, demonstrate, and answer questions about the latest advances in micro- and mini-computers, terminals, personal computers, and word processors.

"Eight years ago UD's Office for Computing Activities (OCA) saw a need to help UD personnel, as well as the general public, make good comparisons on the latest in computing equipment, and the First Annual Computer Fair--one of the first shows of its kind in the Miami Valley--was organized," says Dan Schumacher, manager of special projects for OCA and this year's Computer Fair coordinator. "With rapid changes in the computer industry, this need exists today just as much as, if not more than, in 1977. This year's show will be an excellent opportunity for business associates, scientists, engineers, educators, and hobbyists to compare, evaluate, and discuss with experts in the field the latest advances in computing hardware and software." Over 2,600 attended the fair last year, according to Schumacher.

Admission to the Computer Fair is \$2 for full-time students with a school ID and \$5 for others. Free parking is available.
