CONFERENCE ON BLACK FAMILY TO BE HELD AT UD

DAYTON, Ohio, March 27, 1985 -- "The Black Family: Moving into the 90s" is the title of a conference to be held at the University of Dayton on Friday, April 12. Registration for the conference will begin at 9 a.m., and the conference will run from 9:30 a.m. to 3 p.m. in the Kennedy Memorial Union.

Two sessions focusing on the black family will comprise the day's events. Fran Frazier, special consultant to the black Family Coalition, will speak at 9:30 a.m. on "The Black Family: New Strategies for Growth and Development." At 1:30 p.m., Carol Cummins-Collier, assistant dean of students for resident life at UD, will discuss "The Tale of O," an experience focused on the issue of being different.

Pre-registration for the conference should be completed by April 9. The registration fee is \$20 and includes the luncheon and all training materials.

The conference is sponsored by UD's Center for Afro-American Affairs, Montgomery County's Black Family Coalition, and the Bureau of Alcoholism Services, Combined Health District of Montgomery County.
