FORMER PRESIDENT GERALD FORD TO VISIT UD CAMPUS

DAYTON, Ohio, August 4, 1986 -- Former President Gerald Ford will be the keynote speaker at the University of Dayton during a special lecture series to commemorate the bicentennial of the signing of the U.S. Constitution. The series will include six programs held between September 16 and March 19.

Ford, the 38th president of the United States, will speak Tuesday, September 16, 7:30 p.m. at the UD Arena. He will discuss constitutional government from the perspective of a former congressman and president. The title for his talk is "The Constitution Two Hundred Years Later: Is It Working?" There will be an opportunity for questions from the audience following Ford's presentation.

Other topics and speakers featured during the series include: "Perspectives on the Constitution" by a panel of four members of UD's faculty; "The Right to Privacy and the Constitution: A Dialogue" by Michael J. Perry, professor of law, Northwestern University; "The Concept of Equality and the Constitution" by Frederick Schauer, professor of law at the Univeristy of Michigan; "Constitutional Separation of Powers and the Imperial Presidency" by Robert W. Bennett, dean of the School of Law at Northwestern; and "The

Constitution One Hundred Years from Now: A Look Into the Future" by Garry Wills, journalist, syndicated columnist, and author.
