INTERDISCIPLINARY SERIES BEGINS AT UD

DAYTON, Ohio, September 30, 1986--The University of Dayton will sponsor a talk by Elizabeth Dodson Gray entitled "Eden's Garden Revisited: A Christian Ecological Perspective" on Thursday, October 9, at 7:30 p.m. in the Kennedy Union East Ballroom.

Gray's talk opens the 1986 UD Interdisciplinary Series, "With Both Eyes Open: Seeing Beyond Gender," which will continue through November 13. Her talk is free and open to the public.

A graduate of the Yale Divinity School, Gray is the co-director of the Bolton Institute for a Sustainable Future, a non-profit organization that focuses on ethical dimensions in energy, natural resources, hunger, population, and land use. She currently serves as the coordinator of the Theological Opportunities Program at the Harvard Divinity School.

Gray and her husband, David Dodson Gray, co-wrote the books of "Children of Joy: Raising Your Own Home-Grown Christians" and "Growth and Its Implications for the Future." She has appeared on "Good Morning America" and has lectured extensively on feminist and ecological topics in academic, religious, and public policy settings.

The interdisciplinary series is being made possible in part by the Ohio Humanities Council, a state-based agency of the National Endowment for the Humanities, which makes grants to non-profit organizations in Ohio for public programs in the humanities.
