UD INTERDISCIPLINARY SERIES CONTINUES

DAYTON, Ohio, October 10, 1986--Author, feminist, and biologist Barbara Ehrenreich will give a free lecture on "Gender and Family" Thursday, October 23 at 7:30 p.m. in Miriam Hall's O'Leary Auditorium. The lecture is the second of eight programs in "With Both Eyes Open: Seeing Beyond Gender," an interdisciplinary series on the effects of stereotyped gender roles.

Ehrenreich is the author of "The Hearts of Men: American Dreams and the Flight from Commitment." Her most recent book is Re-Making Love: The Feminization of Sex, co-authored by Elizabeth Hess and Gloria Jacobs. Her book For Her Own Good: 150 Years of the Experts' Advice to Women, co-authored by Deirdre English, was hailed by "Mother Jones" magazine as "the most important feminist book since The Feminine Mystique."

In addition to her writing, Ehrenreich is a fellow at the Institute for Policy Studies in Washington, D.C. and a contributing editor of "Ms." magazine.
