BLACK HISTORY MONTH AT HE

DAYTON, Ohio, February 17, 1987—The University of Dayton Office of Minority Affairs and Career Placement Center are sponsoring a Career Day on Saturday, February 28. "Our Future Is So Bright We've Got to Wear Shades" is the theme for the program, which begins at 10:30 a.m. in the Kennedy Union Ballroom. Admission for the public is \$6.50, which includes the luncheon.
