ZYGON EDITOR MIXES
RELIGION WITH SCIENCE

DAYTON, Ohio, March 2, 1987--Karl Peters, editor of Zygon, the leading professional journal in the field of science and religion, will speak on Monday, March 16, at 8 p.m. in the University of Dayton's O'Leary Auditorium.

He will discuss "Creationism and Evolution: Some Implications for War and Peace." He will consider the creationists' static conception of creation and the evolutionists' dynamic notion of creation, contrasting both views' implications for war and peace.

Peters has been editor of Zygon for the past eight years. He has also been a member of the Institute of Religion in an Age of Science. Peters has published articles including "The Image of God as a Model for Humanization" and "Religion and an Evolutionary Theory of Knowledge."
