EILEEN STEVENS, ALCOHOL AWARENESS ADVOCATE, COMING TO UD

Eileen Stevens, a nationally recognized alcohol awareness advocate, will spend Oct 3-4 at the University of Dayton during Alcohol Awareness Week. She is the founder of C.H.U.C.K., the Committee to Halt Useless College Killings, which she organized following the 1978 alcohol-related hazing death of her son.

Stevens will speak on Monday, Oct. 3 at 7:30 p.m. in the Kennedy Union Ballroom. Admission is free and open to the public. She will also address the Student Development staff on Monday at 2:30 p.m. in the Ballroom and meet with University officials and UD's Alcohol Awareness Committee during her two-day visit.

An outspoken advocate of alcohol awareness, Stevens also has lobbied for anti-hazing laws at the state level. She has appeared on the Phil Donahue and Oprah Winfrey television programs as well as local talk shows.

CIA LECTURE SERIES AT UD CONTINUES WITH SAUL LANDAU ADDRESS

Saul Landau, a senior fellow at the Institute for Policy Studies and a member of the Executive Board of Policy Alternatives for the Caribbean and Central America, will be the second in a series of CIA speakers at the University of Dayton. Landau is the author of "The Dangerous Doctrine: National Security and U.S. Foreign Policy."

The lecture series was designed to spark campus-wide dialogue on the issue of CIA recruitment. Landau will speak on Wednesday, Oct. 5 at 8 p.m. in Boll Theatre in the Kennedy Union. The presentation is free and open to the public. He will be available for media interviews from 7 to 7:30 p.m. in the Kennedy Union Art Gallery.

Other speakers in the lecture series will also be available to speak to the media before their presentations. All media interviews will take place from 7 to 7:30 p.m. in the Kennedy Union Art Gallery. Additional dates and speakers are:

- * Tuesday, Oct. 11: Philip Agee, former CIA agent and author of "Inside the Company," a book that details the CIA's covert operations.
- * Wednesday, Nov. 2: William V. O'Brien, professor of government from Georgetown University. He's a former consultant for the National Conference of Catholic Bishops' Committee on War and Peace.
