LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE WILL FOCUS ON ADOLESCENTS AT RISK

DAYTON, Ohio, October 21, 1988--Approximately 250 educators, counselors, clergy members and school superintendents have registered for a leadership seminar sponsored by the University of Dayton Phi Delta Kappa (PDK) chapter. The seminar, "Adolescents at Risk: Self-Destructive Behavior and Its Implications for Educators," will be held on November 10-11 at the Presidential Banquet Center, 4548 Marstead Circle in Dayton.

Registrations for the seminar will be accepted through Friday, Oct. 28. Cost is \$45. Hours for the seminar are 3:30 to 9 p.m. Thursday, Nov. 10 and 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. Friday, Nov. 11. Graduate credit is available through the University of Dayton or Dayton Public Schools.

Speakers will address a number of topics concerning adolescents, including identifying at-risk adolescents, suicide, self-destructive behavior, substance abuse, discipline, AIDS education and enhancing student self-concept. Speakers from the University of Dayton, Ohio School Boards Association, PDK International, Northern Illinois University, Augustana College, Wright State University, Hamilton County Courts and Xenia City Schools will participate.
