### FAITH IN ACTION TO EXAMINE INDEPENDENT LIVING AIDS

DAYTON, Ohio, December 21, 1988--Faith in Action, an interfaith fellowship of physically disabled adults, will meet on Sunday, Jan. 8 from 1 to 4 p.m. in the rehabilitation department at Miami Valley Hospital. Members will examine the latest developments in adaptive aids for independent living.

Kay Donahue, rehabilitation staff therapist, and Cecilia Emery, clinical coordinator, will demonstrate equipment that has been developed to aid adults with physical handicaps in performing everyday tasks such as cooking, feeding and dressing. "Periodically, it's important for us to update our knowledge of what is available to people with disabilities," said Frank Wiley, president of the planning committee for Faith in Action.

Members of Faith in Action will also tour an independent living apartment during the meeting. A luncheon for the group will be open to patients of the Miami Valley Hospital rehabilitation department.
