ENGINEERING APTITUDE TEST TO BE OFFERED AT UD

DAYTON, Ohio, January 6, 1989--The University of Dayton School of Engineering will offer the National Engineering Aptitude Search (NEAS) test to area high school students on Saturday, Feb. 18 from 9 a.m. to noon. Student applications for the test must be postmarked by Friday, Jan. 13.

The test, developed by American College Testing (ACT), is designed to help pre-college students assess their aptitude for engineering studies prior to entering or choosing a college. Two versions of the test will be given. One is designed for freshmen and sophomore high school students, and the second is for juniors and seniors. Cost will be \$15.

Parents and high school guidance counselors are invited to participate in activities scheduled by the School of Engineering. Coffee, donuts and juice will be served at 8 a.m., with video presentations beginning at 9 a.m. There will be a question and answer session at 10 a.m. with engineering faculty members and university administrators. Admission and financial aid information will be available. A "UD Engineering Preview" at 11 a.m. will feature engineering demonstrations.
