'EYES ON THE PRIZE' MINICOURSE SLATED AT UD

DAYTON, Ohio, January 20, 1989--In conjunction with Black History Month, the University of Dayton will offer a minicourse on "America's Civil Rights Movement--Eyes on the Prize" beginning Wednesday, Feb. 1. This continuing education minicourse offers either 1/2 or 1 unit of credit depending on the level of work selected by participants.

The course, which will feature episodes of the PBS series "Eyes on the Prize," will meet every Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. through March 8. Selected community leaders will participate to offer comments and reactions to the series as well as to relate personal experiences from the 1950s and 1960s. Faculty advisor will be Roberta Alexander, chairperson of the UD history department. Cost of the minicourse will be \$179 for 1 unit of credit or \$90 for 1/2 unit of credit.

"For those persons under 25 years old, the course will certainly fill in the gap a lot of Americans have in their history education concerning the civil rights movement," said Dean Lovelace, coordinator of the minicourse. "For those over 25 years old, the course will allow them to reflect back on an important part of their history. It will remind them of the legacy of Martin Luther King as well as other heroes and heroines and their contribution to America."
