## LOCAL LEADERS WILL EXPLORE UD HUMANITIES INSTITUTE TOPICS

Approximately 25 business leaders will come to the University of Dayton this week to participate in one-day versions of this summer's Dayton Humanities Institute. Sessions will be held in the Kennedy Union on campus on Tuesday, Feb. 28 and Thursday, March 2 from 2 to 9 p.m. with 10 to 12 participants expected each day. Discussions will center on the topics to be presented during the Humanities Institute to be held May 7-26 on campus.

The Dayton Humanities Institute is designed to allow business leaders the opportunity to explore the greatest ideas civilization has produced, under the guidance of UD faculty members. By exploring the ideas of classical and contemporary thinkers and writers, participants will examine questions of corporate, state and personal responsibility.

## EGG DROP, CALCULATOR TOSS SLATED FOR UD ENGINEERS WEEK

The School of Engineering steps into the spotlight this week as University of Dayton students celebrate Engineers Week. It has become an annual ritual at UD for engineering students to stage humorous contests to showcase their creativity and design skills and display more serious engineering projects at an open house for prospective students. **EGG DROP CONTEST:** Wednesday, March 1 at 3:30 p.m. in the lobby of Kettering Laboratories on campus. Contestants will drop raw eggs from the fifth floor to demonstrate the effectiveness of contraptions they have designed to protect the shell.

**CALCULATOR TOSS:** Thursday, March 2 at noon at the tennis practice wall near Kennedy Union. Participants will throw Texas Instrument reject calculators against the stone wall, with judging based on accuracy, creativity of throw and amount of destruction.

**OPEN HOUSE:** Saturday, March 4 from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. at Kettering Laboratories on campus. Judging of student projects will begin at 10 a.m. Six out-of-class projects, including a display of a programmable pill dispenser for the elderly and an anti-lock brake simulation, will be on exhibit during the open house. Prospective students and their parents are invited to attend the open house, designed to highlight UD's engineering program. Tours of campus and engineering facilities will be offered, and a special feature will be a display of a robot that actually paints.
