## **UNIVERSITY OF DAYTON NAMES NEW DIRECTOR OF CAMPUS SECURITY**

**DAYTON, Ohio, April 7, 1989**—The University of Dayton has appointed John Delamer, who has worked in various security posts at the State University of New York at Stony Brook for the past three years, to director of campus security. His appointment, effective June 1, ends a national search and a nine-month review of the University's campus security operation.

Delamer brings 28 years of professional law enforcement experience to the position, including 20 years with the New York City Police Department where he served as patrolman, detective and commanding officer of the 106th detective squad. Since 1981, Delamer has been involved in university security. For five years he served as security manager at New York University Medical Center and for the past three years as assistant director of public safety and acting director of hospital security at the State University of New York at Stony Brook.

Delamer will oversee a campus security operation that currently includes 25 officers, three dispatchers and four traffic office personnel. The department is responsible for security of a 76-acre campus that serves approximately 11,000 undergraduate and graduate students.
