## DONATION TO UD PROVIDES SCHOLARSHIPS FOR THE DAYTON HUMANITIES INSTITUTE

DAYTON, Ohio, April 12, 1989--Six full scholarships to the Dayton Humanities Institute have been donated by a Dayton business leader excited by the concept of corporate executives studying literature, philosophy, history and art to gain perspectives on their professional and community responsibilities. The University of Dayton program will be held May 7-26 on campus.

"The donor feels that the humanities are important for Dayton and he wants to encourage Daytonians to participate," said Frank Henninger, an English professor and director of the Dayton Humanities Institute. "This is an extraordinary opportunity for Dayton's business leaders, for people who are going to be important to their company and the community and for those who have been business leaders."

Designed for middle- to executive-level managers and retired members of the business community, this year's Institute will revolve around the theme of "Freedom and Responsibility: Public and Private." UD is one of the few universities in the nation to offer in-depth seminars for business leaders. The program is modeled on successful similar programs at Dartmouth College, Williams College, Stanford University and the Alpine Institute.

The regular fee for the 1989 Dayton Humanities Institute is \$3,500, and includes all food, lodging and recreational activities. To apply for one of the available scholarships, applicants should submit a one-page application that includes a description of their background and an explanation of how study of the humanities will help in their career advancement.
