**UD MATH PROGRAM  
WINS TWO-YEAR NSF GRANT**

DAYTON, Ohio, January 23, 1990--The National Science Foundation has approved a two-year, \$64,000 grant to help establish a site for an eight-week summer research program at the University of Dayton designed to address the growing national shortage of mathematicians with doctoral degrees.

"Research Experiences for Undergraduates" has been designed by assistant mathematics professor Aparna Higgins and colleague Harold Mushenheim to stimulate interest in mathematical research. The NSF grant will provide \$32,000 a year for two years, with the University funding the balance of about \$26,000.

Eight students--twice as many as participated in last year's pilot project--will pursue individual research topics under faculty direction and present their results at national mathematics meetings. The program, to be held June 18-August 11, is open to students from other universities and participants need not be mathematics majors. Students also earn a \$2,000 stipend for participating in the program.
